During June 2025, ACDC implemented a series of activities aimed at promoting the institutional rights of non-majority communities, advancing human rights, and encouraging public dialogue on key social issues.

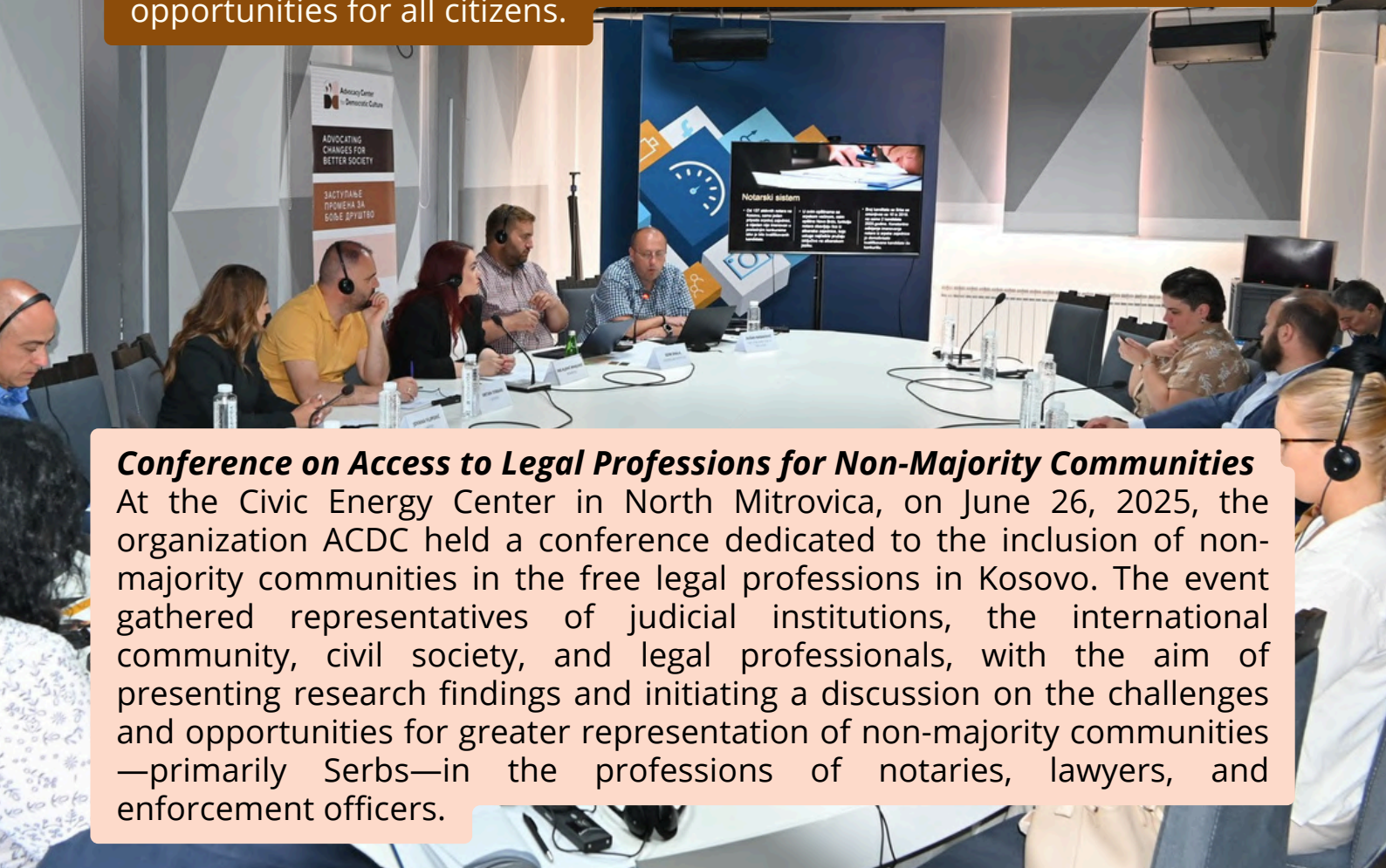
Through the organization of roundtables and conferences, important topics were addressed such as access to public consultations, employment in institutions, barriers in legal professions, and the rights of the LGBTQI+ community.

The month concluded with an art event that contributed, through creative expression, to the visibility of marginalized topics.



Conference on the Employment of the Serbian Community in Kosovo Institutions

On June 24, 2025, ACDC organized a conference dedicated to the challenges faced by members of the Serbian community in gaining employment in Kosovo institutions, with a particular focus on the institutional rights of non-majority communities. The event presented research findings indicating a low level of interest in institutional employment, especially at the central level, linked to political circumstances, social pressure, and administrative barriers. Participants discussed necessary measures to support greater integration and equal opportunities for all citizens.



Conference on Access to Legal Professions for Non-Majority Communities

At the Civic Energy Center in North Mitrovica, on June 26, 2025, the organization ACDC held a conference dedicated to the inclusion of non-majority communities in the free legal professions in Kosovo. The event gathered representatives of judicial institutions, the international community, civil society, and legal professionals, with the aim of presenting research findings and initiating a discussion on the challenges and opportunities for greater representation of non-majority communities—primarily Serbs—in the professions of notaries, lawyers, and enforcement officers.



Roundtable on the Suspension of Child Allowance in North Mitrovica

The suspension of child allowance payments to hundreds of families in Kosovo was the topic of a roundtable organized by ACDC on June 12, 2025, in North Mitrovica. Participants highlighted various issues – from unclear residence verification procedures to technical and administrative errors during the population census. The discussion raised concerns about inconsistent application of criteria, inaccessible information, and difficult communication with responsible institutions. The event aimed to foster dialogue, contribute to understanding the root causes of the problem, and initiate solutions at the institutional level.



Roundtable in Gjilan – Platform for Public Consultations and the Rights of Non-Majority Communities

On June 3, 2025, ACDC organized a roundtable in Gjilan dedicated to the role of the public consultations platform in protecting the rights of non-majority and vulnerable groups. The event explored mechanisms for citizen participation in decision-making processes, the availability of information in community languages, and ways to strengthen institutional transparency and accountability.



Conference in Pristina on the Occasion of the Start of Pride Week

Ahead of Pride Week, on June 9, 2025, ACDC organized a conference at the Barabar Center in Pristina focusing on the advancement of LGBTQI+ rights and equality in Kosovo. The conference addressed current challenges faced by LGBTQI+ individuals, the need for stronger public support, and the creation of safe spaces for identity expression.

Art Event in North Mitrovica as Part of the "Bringing Pride to the North" Project

To close the month, on June 30, 2025, ACDC organized an art event at the Europe House in North Mitrovica, as part of the "Bringing Pride to the North" project. The event featured the work of seven artists who, through installations, publications, and visual works, explored themes of identity, belonging, and freedom of expression. The aim was to use art to inspire dialogue within the local community, open space for understanding diversity, and enhance the visibility of LGBTQI+ topics.



Open Letter Regarding the Practices of the Kosovo Ministry of Internal Affairs

Non-governmental organizations from the Serbian community in Kosovo have expressed concern over the recent deportations of residents with permanent residence in Kosovo, who hold both Kosovo and Serbian citizenship – which is in accordance with the Constitution and laws of Kosovo.

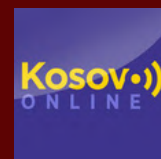
