Successful Completion of ACDC's Youth Camps

During November, the last two youth camps within ACDC's final program cycle were held, marking the successful completion of another phase of our long-term work with young people.


The second-to-last camp took place in mid-November in Prelavac, while the final one was held at the end of November in Gračanica, gathering participants from various municipalities across northern and southern Kosovo. The activities focused on enhancing communication skills, teamwork, and mutual trust — including VOCUP language workshops, team-building tasks, and soft-skills sessions.



A big thank you to all participants, trainers, partners, donors, and our team for making this journey possible, successful, and truly worthwhile.

Within the same project, “Youth Empowered Through Inclusive Schools and Communities (YESS)”, funded by the UN Peacebuilding Fund, UNICEF, and IOM Kosovo, the young camp participants continued their collaboration throughout November by implementing a series of short initiatives dedicated to ecology, culture, and community bonding.

The activities encouraged cooperation among young people from different communities — from cultural visits and environmental actions to sports events. Young participants visited Ordo Drakonis in Gračanica, the Gadime Cave, the Observatory in Pristina, the Bear Sanctuary, and the Gračanica Monastery, strengthening intercultural dialogue through joint learning about science, nature, and cultural heritage.




Promotion of Cultural Heritage – Velika Hoča as an Example of Legal Protection of a Village

Works by artists Živkica Jančić and Stefan Boškočević were presented, while artist Aulona Peci performed her original poem inspired by invisible stories. The event was organized with the Bringing Pride to the North project, aiming to strengthen visibility, understanding, and empathy through art.



Aleksandar Rapajić at the Peace & Democracy Summit



